Description

Silver frame and wooden bottom. Hallmarked. Marked possibly Robert Hennel in London. Pierced and engraved with jester in centre (stamped design). Oval or 'boat' shaped. 4 ball and claw feet screwed to base. Small shelf attached to handle divides for 5 containers. Cruet Frame and Handle: Silver frame and wooden bottom. Hallmarked. Marked possibly Robert Hennel in London. Pierced and engraved with jester in centre (stamped design). Oval or 'boat' shaped. 4 ball and claw feet screwed to base. Handle is screwed to base. Small shelf attached to handle divides for 5 containers. Pot, Mustard Oval glass container with vertical facets. Silver fitting with hinged lid. Urn finial hallmarked possibly London but maker's initials are worn. Spoon, Mustard Sterling silver. Hallmarked probably made in London by George Smith. Scoop shaped bowl - engraved with "H". Bottle, Oil and Stopper Glass, probably machine radial cut facets. Body has slightly graduated sides with inward sloping neck forming into a flat lip. Stopper has flame shaped finial. Bottle, Vinegar and Stopper Glass bottle machine radially cut facets. The bottom cuts are not finished only 3 of 6 complete. Body has slightly graduated sides with inward sloping neck forming into a flat lip. Stopper, a replacement, hand cut with frosted neck. Shaker, Salt and Top Glass with silver top. Hand faceted bottle in vertical panels. Band of smaller cuts divide double panels. Silver fitting for shaking fit tightly on neck but does not screw - is perforated and engraved with floral motif - acorn finial. No markings. Shaker, Pepper and Top Glass with

silver top. Hand faceted bottle in vertical panels. Band of smaller cuts divide double panels. Silver fitting for shaking fit tightly on neck, but does not screw - is perforated and engraved with floral motif - acorn finial. No markings.

Spoon Small gilded spoon with fittings into a piece of cork - hallmarked GL (possibly L) 1H, silhouette, lion passant, S possibly London 1813-1814
