Clarizio Emanuele was a Catholic archbishop. Antonio Riboldi is an Italian Catholic bishop, known for his commitment to the law and justice, in particular for those affected by the Belice earthquake of 1968, and for his efforts against the Camorra. The Romani or Roma, are widely known among English-speaking people by the exonym and racial slur "Gypsies" (or "Gipsies"), which, according to many Romani people, connotes illegality. Romani in Italy are generally known as Zingaro (with the plural Zingari) a word also used to describe a scruffy or slovenly person or a tinker.
