Description

Nanni Balestrini is an Italian experimental poet, author, rebel and visual artist of the Neoavanguardia movement. In 1968, Balestrini was co-founder of the Potere operaio political group and in 1976 was an important supporter of the Autonomia. In 1979, he was accused of membership in the guerilla and fled to Paris and later Germany. Balestrini became known by a larger public thanks to his first novel We Want Everything (Vogliamo tutto, 1971). It describes the struggles and conflicts in the car factory of FIAT. In the following years, the social movements of his time continued to be his subject. With the book The Unseen, he created a literary monument for the "Generation of 1977". Alfredo Giuliani was a writer, poet and literary critic and he was a member of Group 63. Walter Pedullà Italian literary critic.
