Description

Ciriaco Luigi De Mita is an Italian politician. He served as the 47th Prime Minister of Italy from 1988 to 1989. The Christian Democrats did well in the elections of 1987. De Mita waited a year to become Prime Minister, and then served as Prime Minister for a year, maintaining the party chairmanship. At the beginning of that service, on 16 April 1988, in Forlì, Red Brigades killed Senator Roberto Ruffilli, an advisor of De Mita. Tommaso Morlino was a politician and lawyer. He was affiliated with the Christian Democrat party, and was their national adviser from 1954, Deputy Secretary National from 1964 to 1965, and member of the national leadership and executive of several offices of the party. Antonio Giolitti (1915 – 2010) was an Italian politician and cabinet member with the Italian Socialist Party. He is the grandson of Giovanni Giolitti, well-known liberal statesman of the prefascist period.
