Description

The Italian General Confederation of Labour (CGIL) is a national trade union centre in Italy. It was formed by agreement between socialists, communists, and Christian democrats in the "Pact of Rome" of June 1944. But in 1950, socialists and Christian democrats split forming UIL and CISL, and since then the CGIL has been influenced by the Communist Party (PCI). Luciano Lama was a trade unionist and politician, known for being the secretary of the CGIL from 1970 to 1986. Arvedo Forni, historic leader of the CGIL. Piero Boni was a trade unionist and partisan. He took part in the defence of Rome in the ranks of the military organisation of the PSI, the Brigades Matteotti. He was elected Secretary General of the FIOM in 1960, alongside Luciano Lama, and entered as an executive in the CGIL. Giorgio Benvenuto is an Italian trade unionist politician and syndicalist. He was general secretary of Italian Labour Union (UIL) one of the biggest Italian trade union centers from September 30, 1976 to 1992. He was general secretary of Italian Socialist Party (PSI) succeeding Bettino Craxi in 1993
