Aldo Moro was an Italian Christian Democratic politician and the 38th Prime Minister of Italy. A leader of Democrazia Cristiana (Christian Democracy, DC), Moro was considered an intellectual and a patient mediator, especially in the internal life of his party. He was kidnapped on March 16, 1978, by the Red Brigades (BR), a Marxist–Leninist urban guerilla organization, and killed after 55 days of captivity. Benigno Zaccagnini was an Italian politician and physician. Zaccagnini was among the founders of the Democrazia Cristiana (Italian Christian Democracy party).
