Description

Emilio Colombo was an Italian politician and the Prime Minister of Italy from 1970 to 1972. In addition to having held top positions in Italian governments, he was also active in European politics. In November 2003, he admitted to have used cocaine (for "therapeutic purposes") over a 12- to 18-month period. Mario Fabiani (1912 - 1974) was an Italian politician, anti-fascist, and from 1946 to 1951 the first mayor elected in Florence after the war. He was Senator of the PCI from 1963 to 1974. Adamo Vecchi was a politician with the Italian Communist Party and had been one of the directors on the board for RAI-TV.
