Description

Bruno Storti was an Italian trade unionist and secretary general of the CISL, from 1958 to 1976, Member of Parliament as part of the Italian Christian Democratic Party. Luigi Macario (1920 - 1994) was an Italian trade unionist and politician. He had already been active in the reconstruction of Italian syndicalism, and in the process leading to the formation of the CISL (1950), after the breakup of the CGIL unit. In the mid- fifties, he was elected to the national secretariat of the CISL, where he focused in particular organizational policies. In 1963 he was elected general secretary of Fim-Cisl , marking a time of profound political and cultural innovation. In 1971 he returned to conucil. He fought for the unity and autonomy of the union and, along with other leaders of the CISL, was among the leaders of the group of Catholics who took public stand for "no" to the repeal of the law on divorce in the referendum in 1974. CISL is the Italian Confederation of Workers' Trade Unions.
