Description

Giuseppe Umberto "Pino" Rauti was an Italian politician who was a leading figure on the far-right for many years, although Rauti described himself as leftist and non-fascist. Involved in active politics since 1948, he was one of founders and, for many years, the leader of MSI. Giovanni de Lorenzo was a general and politician. Was head of SIFAR (in 1955 - 1,962), general commander of the Carabinieri (October 15, 1962 - 31 January 1966) and Chief of Staff of the Italian Army . He became known for his role in the development of so-called "Piano Solo" (an envisaged plot for an Italian coup in 1964 requested by then President of the Italian Republic, Antonio Segni). The Italian Social Movement (MSI), and later the Italian Social Movement – National Right was a neo-fascist and post-fascist political party in Italy.
