Description

Rosemarie Dexter, best known as Rosemary Dexter, was an Italian film actress of Pakistani origins. Born in Quetta from a British father and an Anglo-Burmese mother, Dexter entered the film industry in 1963, when during a vacation in Rome she met director Ugo Gregoretti who offered her a significant role for his science fiction film Omicron. She then became a very active actress until the mid-seventies, when she retired from acting. Marco Ferreri was an Italian film director, screenwriter and actor, who began his career in the 50s directing three films in Spain.
