### Description

Aldo Moro was an Italian Christian Democratic politician and the 38th Prime Minister of Italy. A leader of Democrazia Cristiana (Christian Democracy, DC), Moro was considered an intellectual and a patient mediator, especially in the internal life of his party. He was kidnapped on March 16, 1978, by the Red Brigades (BR), a Marxist–Leninist urban guerilla organization, and killed after 55 days of captivity. Carlo Donat-Cattin was an Italian politician and trade unionist. A member of Christian Democracy, he was several times minister of the Italian Republic. Giovanni Galloni is a lawyer, politician and academic. One of the founders of the left wing of the Christian Democrats, he was also vice president of the party and deputy secretary twice, in 1965 and in 1977.
