### Description

Ernesto "Che" Guevara commonly known as el Che or simply Che, was an Argentine Marxist revolutionary, physician, author, guerrilla leader, diplomat, and military theorist. A major figure of the Cuban Revolution, his stylized visage has become a ubiquitous countercultural symbol of rebellion and global insignia in popular culture. Padrut Franco was a protagonist of social struggles and peace demonstrations that between 1967 and 1968 had also resulted in prison for political offenses. As a boy he had taken part in the riots of July 1960, which Palermo had caused three deaths. He had rebuilt the causes of the protest and collected at various seminars. He was the regional secretary of the CGIL, and the national secretary for the Communist Party. In 1967, by Secretary of FGCI was arrested during a protest for Vietnam before the consulate of the United States, and he served 18 months' imprisonment.
